Message from Scott Heck, Borough Manager

The Borough of Ringwood has experienced many positive changes this past year. St. Catherine's Parish Center is our new interim Community Center where we are working with the community to offer new and exciting programs and services for all ages. Stonetown Recreation Field has been enhanced to include new bocce courts, pickleball on the tennis courts, and an improved parking area with handicap accessibility. We have also partnered with Rebuilding Together North Jersey, a non-profit organization that provides home improvements to residents in need. On the financial front, the municipal tax rate remains stable, our bond rate is AA+ (excellent credit), and in 2023 we brought in over \$6.5 million in grants.

The new year will bring continued positive changes to our awesome community. We will be hiring an Economic Development Director to enhance and revitalize our shopping districts and industrial areas. We will continue to apply for viable grant opportunities to help our residents and our budget. The installation of a turf field at Stonetown Recreation Field will provide residents with access to more reliable playing surfaces. As you can see, we are committed to meeting and exceeding the needs of all residents, businesses, and visitors through ongoing transformations.

Ringwood is a very special place to live. The beauty of our community not only lies in our landscape, but in our people. I encourage you to interact with your neighbors, join our organizations, and volunteer your time – you will not regret it! The best is yet to come!

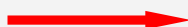

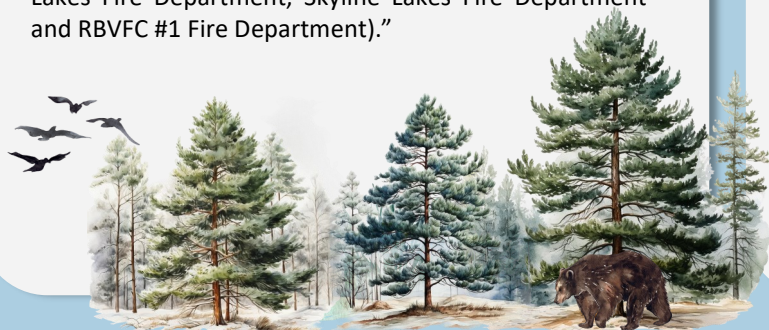

Community ShareCam Program

The [Ringwood Police Video Surveillance Program](#) is a community safety program instituted by the Ringwood Police Department which allows both residents and businesses to partner with the police department in the fight against crime throughout the Borough.

Simply by [registering](#) your home or business surveillance system with the Ringwood Police you can be an invaluable asset in solving crimes in your neighborhood. This footage will help establish leads, identify suspects and save valuable investigative time.

All registered camera locations are stored in a secure database and are entered into our Records Management System allowing the police department to map out locations of cameras throughout the town. Residents and Businesses will only be contacted by Ringwood Police in the event of a crime occurring in the area of their camera coverage.

Snow Removal

We ask that when there is the threat of a snow event, residents try not to park on the street if possible. This will leave the plows more area to clean the roads. Also, our plows make multiple passes over the roads to make them as wide and clear as possible. If you have shoveled your driveway, please know there is a chance you may get more after they pass again. Do not shovel or blow snow into the roadway, it is not only dangerous, it is against the law.

And don't forget to keep fire hydrants clear of snow.

The DPW office hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm. If you have an urgent matter out of these hours, please call the Police Department at 973-962-7017. If it is not urgent, please leave us a message or send us a [Report A Problem](#) through the [Borough website](#) and we will get back to you when we return to the office.

Spring Flushing

Watch for water flushing dates coming up in the spring. These dates will be posted on the [Borough website home page](#) and the [Borough Facebook page](#). Residents will also receive reverse 911 calls (as long as you have signed up for [Smart 911](#)) the night before their area is being flushed.

How to Prepare for Flushing

Some discoloration and lowered pressure may be experienced during flushing. Homeowners are advised to turn the water off at the valve where the water enters the house from the outside service line. This will prevent air from re-entering the line during the flushing process.

The Recycling Center is for Ringwood residents only. No contractor/landscaper dumping is permitted.

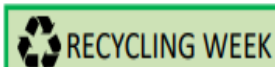
Accepted items: Cardboard, newspaper, mixed paper/junk mail, commingled containers (bottles/cans), plastics #1-7, scrap metal, white goods (appliances), electronics, automobile tires (\$3.00 per car tire, \$10.00 per truck tire fee), used motor oil, automotive batteries, clothing, leaves (must be debagged when dumped), Christmas trees (January only) and small brush.

Items not accepted: Household batteries, plastic shopping bags, propane tanks (empty or full), gasoline, hazardous materials, fluorescent bulbs, cooking oil, latex paint, oil based paint, grass clippings, bamboo, large stumps and logs, and construction/demolition materials, and trash.

How to Prevent Frozen Pipes

- Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals up out of the reach of children.
- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. By temporarily suspending the use of lower nighttime temperatures, you may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job

How to Thaw Frozen Pipes

- If you turn on a faucet and only a trickle comes out, suspect a frozen pipe. Likely places for frozen pipes include against exterior walls or where your water service enters your home through the foundation.
- Keep the faucet open. As you treat the frozen pipe and the frozen area begins to melt, water will begin to flow through the frozen area. Running water through the pipe will help melt ice in the pipe.
- Apply heat to the section of pipe using an electric heating pad wrapped around the pipe, an electric hair dryer, a portable space heater (kept away from flammable materials), or by wrapping pipes with towels soaked in hot water. Do not use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater, charcoal stove, or other open flame device.
- Apply heat until full water pressure is restored. If you are unable to locate the frozen area, if the frozen area is not accessible, or if you can not thaw the pipe, call a licensed plumber.
- Check all other faucets in your home to find out if you have additional frozen pipes. If one pipe freezes, others may freeze, too.

Winter Termination Program

If you are having trouble paying your residential electric, sewer and water service bills this winter, the NJ Department of Community Affairs has a program to protect you from having these utilities turned off from

November 15 through March 15

Who is Eligible?

You qualify for protection during this period if you are being helped by one of the programs listed below:

- Federal Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)
- Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)
- Federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD)
- General Assistance (GA) benefits
- Universal Service Fund (USF)
- Low-income Household Water Assistance Program
- Lifeline Credit Program

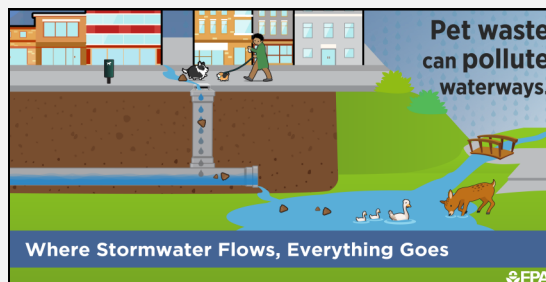
OR

You are unable to pay your utility bills because of circumstances beyond your control such as unemployment, illness, medically related expenses, recent death of an immediate family member, and any other circumstances, which might cause financial hardship.

What do you have to do?

1. If you qualify for protection from shut-off during this period, you should contact your utility company to advise the company that you are eligible for coverage under the State's Winter Termination Program. You should also pay as much as you can on your bill(s) during the winter.
2. Customers also have the option to complete the following Self-Certification form and provide this form to their utility company as a way of notifying the company of their eligibility for protection. When using the Self-Certification form it is recommended that a copy of the form be retained for one's personal records. [Click here for the Self-Certification Form](#)

Please note that completion and submission of the Self-Certification form to your utility company is **NOT** required in order to receive protection under the Winter Termination Program. Protection under the Winter Termination Program can be obtained by verbally advising your utility company(ies) of your eligibility or by submitting this Self-Certification form to the utility company. In either case, please contact your utility company's customer service number to report your eligibility and/or learn how it wishes to receive the Self-Certification form.
