

ANNUAL WALK-IN ADULT INFLUENZA CLINIC

Each year it is highly recommended that people get vaccinated with seasonal Influenza Vaccine to reduce their chances of getting the flu. Early fall is the best time to get vaccinated, but you can still get vaccinated in December and later since the flu season can last as late as May. Each vaccine contains 3 influenza viruses, which change each year based on scientist's estimations about which types and strains of viruses will circulate in a given year. It takes about 2 weeks after vaccination for antibodies that provide protection against flu virus infection to develop in the body.

PLEASE NOTE: Anyone who has a severe allergy to chicken eggs, or people who have had a severe reaction to a flu vaccination in the past, or anyone who developed Guillain-Barre syndromes (GBS) within 6 weeks of getting a prior flu shot, or anyone who currently has a moderate or severe illness with a fever, should not receive the flu vaccine. Consult your private physician for further advice.

ATTENTION SENIORS W/ MEDICARE PART B: The higher dose of influenza vaccine will be offered to adults 65 years of age and older. This is billable to Medicare Part B only. You must bring your government-issued Medicare card with you. We will not be able to accept any other Medicare cards.
